There was a James Ward associated with Fortune Hospital at Forton in Gosport much later in the 18th century – there *might* be a connection here.

Her matys ships the tartar & Foulstone & lyme, being ordered to be refitted at Portsmouth for Channell Service. You are to take their Guns and Gunner's Stores during the doing thereof and send up her remaine as usuall.

The Surveyor General will be with you on Tuesday or Wednesday next, you must acquaint Mr. Ward that the board cannot to give him more than 40^s a yeare for the ground on which the Hospitall stands which was his usuall allowance to his predicessors
