as he stands Obliged for have ported Stores from the
Tower to this place.

The 'Two Brothers Pinke' refers to a hoy (small single masted transport vessel) called 'Two Brothers' which was a pinke (a vessel with a narrow stern) commanded by Francis Masters.

Although spelt 'Fellon' in this document, it is believed that the storekeeper at Woolwich was Mr. J.Felton.
