what they have writ to the Board upon advising
wth y^u that' tis impossible for them to take them
in- therefore if whats reputed be fact &
that neither of our own VeSsels at Portsmouth can
be spared from the imediate Service of the Office
to bring them wth the Small Arms wanting
Stocking and Locking, you may put y^e said on
board together wth the uns old Iron Ordn^{ce} &c^a
the Pomroy, James Swift Ma^r & consign the
Mortars & Gunns to Woolwich, & the rest to y^e Tower
