

Since I rec^d yours of the 10th instant, the Board had directions from the Admiralty to cause his Ma^{tys} ship The <u>Prince Frederick</u> to be furnished with two hundred & ninety seven Barrells of Powder for the present Expedition to be delivered into the charge of the Master Gunner, which is almost answerable to what you have complied with at <u>S^r John Norris's</u> request.

As to the grape shot, if you have an opportunity of Seeing S^r John Norris, you may acq^t him that we have met with some difficulties in getting them received by the men of war, & have been at last obliged to send down a Vessel on purpose to the ships at Chatham, & desire that the Gunners may have particular charge to be very careful of them
